Village Green Status

On March 20th an application for "Village Green" status for the Woughton Pavilion sports fields was submitted to MK council by the parish council in order to protect it from future commercial or residential development.

Councillor Andrew Humphreys, the named applicant, is acting on our behalf, supported by 71 parish residents who have completed 55 evidence based questionnaires to back the formal application. MKBC will hold a public meeting in due course with a panel of Borough Councillors to review the application and decide if the evidence given meets with the criteria to grant "Village Green" status.

Our bus: the 18

The number 18 bus now runs at hourly intervals

through our Parish, a big step forward from the previous limited timetable. Lobbying by the Parish Council and Ward Councillors resulted in the service getting a



sizeable subsidy from MK Council. To ensure that this service continues, we all need use it.

The route runs from Bletchley to CMK (the Point) through Fenny, Simpson, Woughton Park, Woughton on the Green and the Woolstone's calling at the Hospital on alternate journeys. Woughton on the Green to CMK takes just 11 minutes and 14 minutes to Bletchley. No parking problems or charges and free travel with the *Older Person's Bus Pass*.

Right of Way re-instated

The Parish Council have worked with Milton Keynes Council and our ward councillors to get



the Parks Trust to install a new 'kissing gate' outside the Village Hall. This long standing right of way had been restricted for some

years by the need to climb over a locked gate. Residents and other members of the public can now pass freely and easily across the Green, from the end of Baskerfield Grove to the Village Hall.

War Memorial to be rejuvenated

The Parish Council have instructed a local stone mason to clean, repair and restore the WWI memorial outside St Marys Church in Woughton on the Green. All Parish Councils are responsible for the upkeep of any war memorials in their parish, so this is an important task for us to undertake. The work will be completed over the summer.
