# Welcome to the February 2016 issue of the Old Woughton Parish Council Newsletter.

### Parish Precept 2016 - 2017

• At its meeting on 11th January 2016, Old Woughton Parish Council decided that there would be no increase in the Parish precept for the 2016-17 year. This means that you will pay the same as you did for this financial year and the previous one. In the 4 years of its life, the size of the Old Woughton precept has been reduced 7 fold from the £167 per band D property we inherited when we were founded.

Our capital investment programme in The Patch Allotments to overcome previous years of neglect is tailing-off. Furthermore, improved financial and management arrangements offer the clear possibility of the Patch's budget going into surplus for the first time in the forthcoming financial year.

You can be assured that we will only raise taxes from our residents that are strictly necessary and we will continue to focus on keeping our costs and spending under rigorous review.

# **Canal Towpath**

The project to repair some of the canal towpath is now awaiting the Canal and River Trust's budget approval. It is currently proposed to start with a small pilot stretch by Bridge 90B in Woughton Park between Castle Rose and Foxton.

We are looking for a few volunteers to help with this exciting community project.

# **Police Community Support Officers**

At the Parish Council Meeting on January 11th we listened to two PCSO's explaining their role to us.

The area office for our parish is in Woburn Sands, operated by a sergeant and 2 constables.

Our local office is based at Fishermead and our regular PCSO is Colin Cooper – you may have spotted him around the area on his bicycle. He is



the point of contact for our community and we are assured that he or one of his colleagues will turn out for just about anything, even if only to reassure. They will also offer crime reduction advice and assess homes for vulnerability. They suggested that a call to the 101 service when residents were going away on holiday was helpful to them as well as reassuring to homeowners — they will keep an eye on the home whilst out on patrol.
